

Cardiovascular Health Promotion: the Impact of Immersive Virtual Reality



Empowering Caregivers, Enhancing Lives

The project CaregIVR, involving Portugal, Spain, Poland and Italy, aims to empower informal caregivers by increasing their literacy on cardiovascular disease and promoting the development of quality skills in the provision of care to post-stroke patients, through innovative strategies such as immersive virtual reality.

Navigating the World of Cardiovascular Care through Virtual Reality

During the month of March, a survey was carried out in order to better understand the conditions of informal carers. 120 questionnaires were completed, including a third of vulnerable groups such as Ukrainian refugees. The data acquired will be essential for comparative analysis and support activities throughout the project. In April, Promotion Sessions were conducted to present the project to it's beneficiaries.
